MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING between ROYAL CANADIAN MARINE SEARCH AND RESCUE INC. (RCMSAR) and THE RCMSAR MEMBER

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Memorandum of understanding (MOU) is to set out the Search and Rescue (SAR) objective of RCMSAR along with the principal terms and conditions which apply to volunteers that are accepted as RCMSAR members.

BACKGROUND

Canadian law, like that of most maritime nations, requires that vessels at sea respond to distress situations to the extent they can do so without un-due risk. However, many public minded Canadians in a position to do so, voluntarily go out of their way to assist fellow mariners in distress.

In the late 1970's, it became evident that if some of these marine volunteer efforts could be coordinated to function as part of Canada's Search and Rescue system, more could be achieved by the same level of volunteer effort. As a result, the Canadian Coast Guard (CCG) initiated the formation of a national response to provide the framework for this co-ordination. That national response is the Canadian Coast Guard Auxiliary (CCGA).

In the early 2000's, RCMSAR began contracting on behalf of all RCMSAR locations the expansion of SAR services to other BC provincial agencies including Ministry of Emergency Management and Climate Readiness (EMCR), and BC Emergency Health Services (BCEHS).

OBJECTIVE

The common objective of the RCMSAR and the CCG is: "The prevention of loss of life and/or injury at sea, including, where possible and directly related thereto reasonable efforts to minimize damage to or loss of property."

Accepted RCMSAR members, in volunteering their services, agree to assist the RCMSAR and CCG in meeting this objective through SAR Operations and Boating Safety activities, consistent with the terms of this MOU. Members receive no profit or personal gain from these activities and forego all associated rights to claim salvage while on authorized SAR activities.

ORGANIZATION

RCMSAR is registered as a non-profit charitable corporation which has a Chair and Board of Directors elected by the membership at an Annual General Meeting held for that purpose. The Board of Directors, under the leadership of the Chair, oversees the activities of the organization. The day-to-day operations of RCMSAR are delegated to the Chief Executive Officer (CEO).

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MEMBERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

RCMSAR members agree to:

- 1. Volunteer extended hours including weekends and statutory holidays and be on standby as required.
- 2. When on standby, commit to attending the vessel within thirty (30) minutes of notification.
- 3. Comply with all RCMSAR bylaws, policies, guidelines, standards, and operating procedures.
- 4. Undertake training identified by RCMSAR as necessary for the safe and effective conduct of SAR activities.
- 5. Obtain and maintain skills, knowledge, and certifications required to assist and participate in RCMSAR activities.
- 6. Carry out their duties in difficult, hazardous, adverse, or stressful conditions.
- 7. Undertake only those activities which can be done without causing un-due risk to themselves, their vessels, other persons, or other vessels and to take all reasonable precautions which may be prudent under the circumstances.
- 8. Conduct themselves in a professional manner (both on duty and off duty) so as to not bring disrepute to RCMSAR and its stakeholders.
- 9. Undertake the RCMSAR annual safety test and complete a Physical Activity Readiness Questionnaire (PAR-Q).
- 10. Provide a medical clearance from a health practitioner should any concerns be identified through the PAR-Q.
- 11. Report any personal condition that may compromise the member's ability to safely carry out their duties.

RCMSAR RESPONSIBILITIES

RCMSAR agrees to:

- 1. Reimburse members for out-of-pocket expenses incurred by members when on RCMSAR business or undertaking activities authorized or directed by RCMSAR as contemplated by RCMSAR policy.
- 2. Provide insurance protection to members to cover members and their vessels while engaged in authorized RCMSAR activities.
- 3. Ensure members are kept informed of RCMSAR guidelines and other information needed by members to properly undertake authorized activities.
- 4. Provide education/training to members, subject to the availability of resources, to improve needed skills and capabilities.

ENROLLMENT AND TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP

Either RCMSAR or the member can terminate this Memorandum of Understanding (which terminates the applicable membership) at any time pursuant to the Human Resources policies governing resignations, discipline etc. and the RCMSAR bylaws governing termination of membership.

Renewal of a member's membership is at the sole discretion of the CEO, RCMSAR.

I understand there are certain risks and perils inherent in any such activity and I assume full responsibility for any inherent risk and danger to myself.

RCMSAR will defend and hold me harmless from and against any and all claims, damages, suits, liabilities, or expenses, including without limitation reasonable legal fees arising from an action, allegation or claim arising from your participation in any RCMSAR approved activities or tasking save and except where you were negligent.
